The Committee wishes to nominate the following members for these positions;

Vice President - Mickey Ohland

Proposed By-laws Amendments

Several proposed changes to the Club's By-laws have been brought to the Board of Directors in the past year. On September 13, 2004 the BOD met and discussed these proposed by-laws changes. The BOD recommends that the following changes be instituted;

1. September 13, 2004. It is proposed the we add the following paragraph to Article II, Section 2, Paragraph E to the by-laws;

E. Yearly dues received from first time applicants after October 1st of the current calendar year shall carry over to include membership for the following calendar year as well.

2. September 13, 2004. It is proposed that Article I, Section 4, paragraphs E and F be removed from the by-laws.

E. The maximum number of memberships, adult and youth, shall not exceed 250.

F. When the total club membership reaches the maximum number of 250, the Membership Chairman shall establish a waiting list of applicants desiring to join the Club. The list will be maintained in order of the date an application was received. No distinction will be made between applicants for reinstatement and new applicants. When a vacancy occurs, the next applicant on the list will be offered the opportunity to join the club.

These proposed changes will be discussed and voted on by the general membership at the December meeting. ■

Treasurer's Report

At this date we have 257 members and 17 family members. Dues for the 2005-year can be paid any time in November thru January. The price of fun has not changed, only \$40.00 per year to support the best flying club in this valley. AMA membership renewal each year is a requirement to maintain your EVA membership. This is very important for our flying club. AMA furnishes the site insurance required by Arizona State Land Lease Dept. The current roster of members is submitted to AMA in March or April for number verification. A member whose AMA number is not current, EVA will deny flying privileges until their AMA membership is current.

EVA is in good financial condition going into the new flying season. With all bills paid and deposits made and as of November, we have \$6,012.00 cash on hand and \$8,000.00 in the club reserve fund. We need to keep the reserve fund growing because our lease expires in October 2007. With home building going wild around us, we may not get another 5-year lease and have to move the field. Our State Lease is \$200.00 per month at this time.

Minutes of EVA Meeting

October 2, 2004

The October meeting of the East Valley Aviators was held at the field for the first time and it was a huge success. The weather cooperated and was beautiful. BOD members present were President Olen Trenary, Vice President Mickey Ohland, Treasurer Verlin Boeder, Secretary Gene Coleman and Newsletter Editor Doug Sharpe. Also in attendance were 50 other members and several guests. Free muffins, donuts, and soft drinks were available to all.

Olen asked new members to stand and identify themselves. Greg Morey, Al Neihold, Rusty Bolin and Bruce Van Dyke introduced themselves as newbies. Please make them feel welcome whenever you see them at the field. We pride ourselves on being the friendliest club in the valley.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the minutes of our last meeting. Unanimously approved by all. Next Verlin gave the treasurers report and a motion was made and seconded to accept the treasurers' report. Unanimously accepted.

Olen mentioned that Tom Helman, our training coordinator was sent to Florida to help repair the computers shut down by the hurricanes. Tom works for CVS Pharmacies. I am sure he will be back for our December business meeting.

Olen stressed safety as being our number one concern as a serious accident could shut us down. Olen read about an incident in High Flight (IMAAC) magazine about an individual that was hit by a runaway 40 % bi-plane and received very serious injuries including almost losing his leg above the ankle. Safety cannot be stressed enough. It should be emphasized that you should have an observer at your station while flying to help you keep an eye on your plane. With the advent of the winter (snowbird) season, and the closing down of Rusty Bolins' field, this is of primary importance as sometimes all flying stations will be filled. Ask a friend to assist you in spotting while you fly. You can do the same for him. Olen also mentioned that if you break a hole in the new

fence with a prop, please repair it with the materials in the shed.

Cleanup up day was designated as November 6 and Fun Fly/Swap meet day will be November 13, 2004. Please give us a hand on November 6 to clean up your field.

New Business. Mickey Ohland and Doug Sharpe and a 3rd to be named member will form up the nominating committee for the proposal of 3 candidates for the positions of Vice President, Secretary and 1 Safety Officer to be voted on in December. If anyone is interested in these posts, contact Mickey or Doug.

By law changes to be voted on are 1. Remove our 250 member cap and 2. make a by law to coincide with AMA policy of making new members enrolled after October 1 of any year to have their membership good for 15 months at the same price of a one year membership. Both will be put to the membership for a vote in December.

Olen would like us all to keep Roy Wolters in our prayers as Roy has a terminal illness. It doesn't keep Roy from the field and that is great. Pappy Flora also had recent open heart surgery and was present at our meeting today looking all fat and sassy. Welcome back Pappy.

No show and tell items showed up today. Prize drawings were held and some lucky members went home happy. Others, like me, did not. Meeting adjourned at 8:50 AM. *Gene* ■
